

Cornice Nr. 103 “Essex” (Georgian in Style)

Another “drip” cornice moulding. This term refers to the overhanging member part way down this section.

It was originally a Greek design feature with the entirely practical purpose of protecting expensive external stonework from water staining and erosion by drawing rainwater away from the building face.

This is a slightly “below average” sized cornice design. Consider using this one in modern homes or on projects with lower ceilings. If you want a larger design think about numbers 102, 104 or 105.


